

WEEK 1: Read Jeremiah 1:1-10

Thank God for knowing you, forming you, calling you, sending you; for promising to be with you and deliver you.

Ask God to put words in your mouth by His Holy Spirit as you pray and witness so that you can break down and overthrow the works of the Enemy and build and plant God's works in your school.

WEEK 2: Read Jeremiah 9:23, 24

Thank God for being available to be known by us; for exercising lovingkindness, justice and righteousness on earth.

Ask God to forgive you/students/teachers in your school for boasting in wisdom, might, or riches, rather than trusting in the Lord, and to help you/them to understand and know Him.

WEEK 3: Read Jeremiah 10:1-16

Praise God because there is none like Him; He is great and mighty, the true and living God, the everlasting King, Creator of the heavens and earth, Maker of all, wise and understanding.

Ask God to forgive you/students/teachers in your school for serving idols (self, money, wisdom, the occult, false religions...) and to help you/them turn from idols to serve the True God.

WEEK 4: Read Jeremiah 17:5-14

Thank God for being able to search the heart and test the mind, and judge righteously; for blessing those who trust in Him.

Ask God to heal and save you/students/teachers in your school; to help you trust in Him so you will not fear and will be fruitful even in difficult times.

WEEK 5: Read Jeremiah 23:3-6

Thank God for sending Jesus, the wise and just King, the Lord our Righteousness.

Ask God to gather together a remnant of His people on your campus and make them fruitful so they will multiply; to raise up good leaders who will care for His people on your campus.

WEEK 6: Read Jeremiah 23:9-29

Praise God that He is near and not far off; that He fills the heavens and the earth and no man can hide from Him.

Praise God for His Word which is like fire, and like a hammer which shatters rock.

Ask God to stop false prophets from leading students and teachers at your school into futility, and to raise up true prophets who will stand in God's council and announce His words in truth in your school, so that students and teachers will be turned from their wicked ways.

WEEK 7: Read Jeremiah 29:1-13

Thank God for His faithfulness to His promises; for His good plans for you and your school; for His availability to be found by anyone who seeks Him wholeheartedly.

Ask God for blessings on your school (seek the welfare of your school); for discernment to not listen to false prophets and lies from the Enemy; for other students and teachers to call upon God and pray with you.

WEEK 8: Read Jeremiah 30:1-11(a), 17(a)

Thank God for his promises to save, restore, deliver and heal.

Ask God to deliver students and teachers from distress and disease; to break the yokes of slavery to sin, occultism, humanism, alcoholism, drugs, etc.; to save them that they may serve Him.

Ask God for courage, that you may not fear or be dismayed.

WEEK 9: Read Jeremiah 31:31-36

Praise God for His faithfulness to the nation of Israel.

Praise God, the Lord of Hosts, for His creative power.

Ask God to write His law within the hearts of students and teachers in your school that they may be His people, and He will be their God; that they may know Him, and He will forgive their sins.

WEEK 10: Read Jeremiah 32:1-27

Praise God, the Creator of the heavens and the earth, for His mighty power; for His lovingkindness; for His justice to reward man according to his deeds; for His greatness in counsel; for His mighty deeds; that nothing is too difficult for Him.

Ask God to help you obey Him even when you don't understand His plans, or when His instructions don't make sense to you (God told Jeremiah to buy land which was about to be taken over by enemies).

Ask God to help you trust Him even when circumstances are difficult (Jeremiah was in prison).

WEEK 11: Read Jeremiah 32:28-44

Praise God for His mercy toward sinful man; for His faithfulness to His covenant.

Ask God to forgive the sins of your university community, including serving other gods, refusing God's instruction, abortion (see v. 35), and others.

Ask God to help students and teachers fear Him always, for their own good and the good of their children.

WEEK 12: Read Jeremiah 33:1-11

Praise the Lord who made the earth for His promise to answer when we call to Him.

Give thanks to the Lord of Hosts, for He is good, and His lovingkindness is everlasting.

Ask God to bring health and healing to your university community; to bring abundance of peace and truth; to cleanse students and teachers from sin and forgive them; to bring praise and glory to Himself because of the good He will do to your school; to raise up a community of saints in your school who will bring thanks to Him.

WEEK 13: Read Jeremiah 33:14-26

Praise God for sending Jesus, the righteous Branch of David, to be our High Priest before God.

Praise Jesus that He will carry out justice on earth.

Ask God to have mercy on your university community and to help students and teachers receive Jesus as Lord and Savior.

Additional instructions for **WEEKS 14-18**: When you meet, spend some time in worship, praising and thanking God for who He is and what He has done. Then read and discuss the suggested chapter(s). What happens in this passage? What can you learn from this? Pray accordingly.

WEEK 14: Read Nehemiah 1 & 2.

Pray for favor with administrators and other authorities in your school, and for boldness to request a room and anything else you need to carry on student ministry.

Pray for other students and teachers to join you in your work.

WEEK 15: Read Nehemiah 4.

Pray for unity, wisdom, boldness and a mind to work to build a Christian community on your campus in spite of possible ridicule or aggressive conspiracy against you.

WEEK 16: Read Nehemiah 6.

Pray for wisdom and discernment so you will not believe the lies of the Enemy or fall into his traps and sin or become discouraged or frightened.

Pray for perseverance to complete your work, so that it will be recognized that it was accomplished with the help of your God.

WEEK 17: Read Nehemiah 8.

Pray for proclamation of the Word of God in your school and that students and teachers will respond by obeying it, confessing their sins, and worshipping God.

WEEK 18: Read Nehemiah 12.

Give praise and thanks to God for what He has already done in your school and for what He is going to do.

Celebrate! You may sing or read the words to some praise songs or psalms, or write your own.

WHAT'S NEXT? Continue meeting together regularly in small groups for prayer, worship, fellowship, Bible study and outreach. Contact **Students for Christ-Ukraine** for more materials and training.

WHO?

You and at least one other Christian student or teacher from your school. If you don't know anyone who wants to pray with you, contact SFC or your pastor for help. Begin praying anyway and persistently ask God to bring someone to join you.

WHAT?

Use the following prayer guide. Or choose a psalm or other Bible passage to get started. Worship God. Ask the Holy Spirit to guide your prayer, then follow His lead. Spend some time just listening.

WHEN?

At least once a week. Every day or every other day if you wish!

WHERE?

Meet somewhere in or near your school. Find an empty room or a quiet corner. Sit in the cafeteria. Walk through the halls or outside around the buildings.

HOW?

Pray out loud if you can, one at a time so you can listen to each other and agree together. You may open your eyes if you are in public so it looks like you are just talking to each other. Pray silently if you must, but at the same time. Always pray in the name of Jesus.

WHY?

To glorify God at your school by planting and growing a community of believers there. 2 Cor. 5:20.

INTRODUCTION/SAMPLE:

Read Joshua 1:1-9.

Thank God for saving you and calling you to serve Him; for giving you your school as a mission field; for His promise to be with you.

Ask God to give you strength and courage for your mission; to help you meditate on His Word and obey it so you will have success.
